Worth Every Bit of Struggle

In the 1940s, the United States Navy expropriated much of the Caribbean island of Vieques, Puerto Rico, and constructed a weapons testing and training site. For almost 60 years, the citizens were sandwiched between a weapons depot and a bombing range. On May 1, 2003, the Navy ceased all testing and training on the island, beginning a complicated process of demilitarization and decontamination.
